



Britain in Bloom

Over the course of his life, the botanist George Forrest made seven collecting expeditions to the then-remote Chinese province of Yunnan. The "Scottish plant hunter" returned to Edinburgh's Royal Botanic Garden with more than 10,000 species - the largest collection of wild Chinese plants outside the country - including a vast array of rare rhododendrons. 






NOLA Gets Jazzed

In the countryside between Marrakech and Essaouira, argan oil cooperatives provide microloan opportunities for women in need. Goats there eat the fruit from the argan tree, and local women collect and process the expelled nuts, producing argan oil, which is used in skincare products. "Our daughter Emily [shown here] was familiar with the work these coops are doing and wanted to see the process - and the goats - firsthand," says Virtuoso traveler Betsy Reeder of Waco, Texas.

THE TRIP

Betsy and her husband. Phil. celebrated Emily's early graduation from college by letting her choose somewhere she'd always wanted to go, and their

private, 18-day Morocco journey with Heritage Tours was born, with help from New Hampshire-based Virtuoso travel advisor Kim Davis-Smith. They spent the night in a **Bedouin camp**, rode camels, visited an authentic hammam, wandered Marrakech's famous medina, took a cooking class, and more.



Travel blogger Aubrey Daquinag shares her photographs and sense of curiosity in Wander Love: Lessons, Tips & Inspiration from a Solo Traveller. Survey Says

More Americans are getting up from their desks and out on vacation, according to a recent study by the U.S. Travel Association. While the trend is encouraging, 52 percent of the country's work-weary still report leaving unused vacation days on the table. (Your Virtuoso travel advisor has ways to remedy that!) Other key findings:

- Americans forfeited 212 million vacation days in 2017 - equal to \$62.2 billion in lost benefits, or \$561 per employee.
- What keeps them from taking vacations? Nearly two-thirds (61 percent) of workers cite the fear of appearing replaceable. Other top barriers include a heavy workload and lack of coverage at work (56 percent each).





Jordan: Beyond the Rose-Red City

Petra, the world-renowned archaeological

site in southern Jordan, is the country's biggest attraction. As you approach the ancient city through the winding, mile-long canyon pathway known as the Sig, says Virtuoso travel advisor Shawn Kirschenman, the most spectacular sighting occurs just as you negotiate the final turn. It's there that "a sliver of the magnificent Al-Khazneh [Treasury] comes into view," he describes. "Each step reveals more and Be There: Your more, until suddenly, the narrow, dark gorge opens into a sunny plaza, where the complete masterpiece is revealed."

The Seattle-based advisor, who recently traveled to Jordan on a familiarization tour arranged through the Adventure Travel Trade Association, says the Rose-Red City is indeed a sight to behold. Yet Kirschenman emphasizes that this Middle East country is "so much more than Petra." Here, a few of his impressions.

IN PLAY

"Jordan is an active adventurer's dream, from hiking to horseback riding to snorkeling in the Red Sea. In Wadi Hidan, one of the country's hidden treasures, we went floating and swimming through the black basalt canyon in water up to our necks."

PEDAL POWER

"We spent two days cycling some 40 miles on the new Jordan Bike Trail, and now I couldn't imagine experiencing this dynamic country any other way. About halfway through our ride, we somehow found the energy to scramble up the rocks and watch the most magnificent sunset."



The world's first UNESCO World Heritage city turns 40.

comes with being first - although vou wouldn't know it from walking the cobblestoned streets of Centro Histórico (Old Town) in Quito, the first city to be declared

THERE'S A CERTAIN CACHET THAT

a UNESCO World Heritage site. In pretty Plaza de la Independencia, life goes on much as it has for the last half century, with locals deep in discussion on palm-shaded benches next to hawkers selling handmade crafts and crispy llapingachos (potato pancakes).

That ageless charm is why now is the time to visit the Ecuadorian capital, home to Latin America's best-preserved colonial center. This year marks the 40th anniversary of Quito's inscription into UNESCO, and while the city isn't making much of a to-do over the occasion (except, perhaps, for some extra-dazzling light installations

during the annual Fiesta de la Luz, August 8 through 12), you'll still find new and noteworthy attractions among its many baroque churches and pastel palaces.

For example, sections of the sixteenth-century Saint Francis Convent complex (477 Cuenca) were recently restored, including the Franciscan brewery and fountain in the main cloister. At Catedral Metropolitana (715 Venezuela and Espejo), visitors can now descend to the catacombfilled, underground crypt and ascend a narrow passageway that leads to one of the city's finest rooftop views. For a sweet break, head to the official store of Pacari chocolate (N3-153 Venezuela and Espejo), whose bars swept the "plain/origin dark chocolate" category at the 2017 International Chocolate Awards.

OYSTER MANIA

Across the U.S., a raft of new oyster bars are championing the simple perfection of naked shellfish. Here are three worth the trip.





MEW ORLEANS

NOLA's new Pythian Market food hall contains a pearl in the oyster-and-bubbles bar **Cru** (234 Loyola Avenue). Belly up for a selection of Gulf Coast and East Coast oysters, as well as mollusks done tempura-style with truffle mayo, savory small dishes such as tuna tartare, and caviar from **Marlon Alexander**, a former personal chef to Christina Aguilera.

◀ LOS ANGELES

Virginia's **fourth-generation family-run** Rappahannock Oyster Co. has gone west with the **Rappahannock Oyster Bar** (787 S. Alameda Street) in downtown L.A. The menu goes beyond bivalves to include clams, scallops, and shrimp, but you'll have a hard time passing up its Rappahannock, Rochambeau, and Olde Salt varieties.

PORTLAND, OREGON

Overlooking Portland's riverfront, **King Tide Fish & Shell** (*1510 SW Harbor Way*)
shucks a rotating selection of local
oysters from **sustainable sources** daily.
Follow them up with some fresh fish
crudo, *tiradito*, or ceviche from the raw
bar. Next course: whole grilled fish.





The Amalfi Coast: Cruise or Clifftop?

Pick your perch for soaking up this iconic corner of Italy. By Susan Hanson



TALY'S AMALFI COAST IS A PHOTOGRAPHER'S DREAM, with each hairpin twist and turn on the region's roads revealing one **postcard-worthy shot** after another. "The Amalfi Coast is all about the views," says Adamarie King, a Virtuoso travel advisor who lives part-time in Italy. "Most travelers are familiar with the photos of **pretty pastel houses** cascading down the hillside into the sea, and that's what they expect to find. Luckily, it's all there for them to discover."

This rugged 30-mile stretch overlooking the Tyrrhenian Sea – awash in soaring cliffs, sparkling bays, **medieval towns**, and humble fishing villages – has been a playground for the jet-set crowd since Augustus Caesar built a villa on nearby Capri in the first century. Whether you're settling into a cliffside suite or arriving via cruise ship, that playground can get pretty popular, so King's best advice is to work with your travel advisor to get off the tourist circuit and experience local culture: Hike up to a hidden valley, take a **cooking lesson** in a rural farmhouse, taste wines at a family-run vineyard, or pop into a local trattoria for lunch. King's favorite times of the year to visit are spring and fall, when "the beaches are less crowded, and the weather is lovely."



CRUISE

Spend a day in Amalfi on **Oceania Cruises**' Rome-to-Venice voyage on the 684-passenger *Nautica*. Stroll through **Villa Rufolo's gardens**, pick up souvenirs in Positano, or sip limoncello in a cozy café. Other stops on the ten-day sailing include Sicily, Malta, and Montenegro, but the dolce vita lifestyle remains on board at Toscana, the ship's restaurant serving Tuscan-inspired cuisine. *Departure: October 27, 2018; from \$1,699*.



CLIFFTOP

Legend has it that the three islets of Li Galli – just off
Positano and known as the "Sirenuse" – were inhabited
by sirens who lured sailors to their shores. Today's visitors
are seduced by **Le Sirenuse**, an eighteenth-century villa
with 58 rooms that feature vaulted ceilings, handmade
tiles, old-master paintings, and, of course, those **stunning**coastal views. Doubles from \$879; Virtuoso travelers

Winners All

Here's to this year's Virtuoso Sustainable Tourism Leadership Awards finalists, whose efforts are creating a brighter future for everyone. **By Costas Christ**

USTAINABLE TRAVEL HAS GONE FROM TREND TO transformative movement, and the list of innovators within the Virtuoso network helping advance this cause runs long and deep. Wilderness Safaris, for example, commenced operations in 1983 with a mission of **conservation through tourism**, and Fairmont Hotels & Resorts was the first hospitality company in North America to establish green operations, as far back as 1990.

Today, the Virtuoso Sustainable Tourism Leadership Awards, now in its eighth year, recognizes companies that are committed to travel that is environmentally friendly, protects cultural heritage, and contributes to the well-being of local people. "It's incredibly inspiring to see what Virtuoso partners, large and small, are doing to **make the world a better place**," says Sue Kasmar, a Santa Barbara-based Virtuoso agency owner and one of eight travel-advisor judges who helped narrow this year's 150 award entries down to five nominees in each of two categories: Hotels and Tour Operators. We'll announce the winners for each category in mid-August at our annual luxury travel conference and on Virtuoso.com. In the meantime, here are the ten finalists.

HOTELS

EMIRATES ONE&ONLY WOLGAN VALLEY Australia

This resort in the Greater Blue Mountains has **restored natural habitat** for rare wildlife and planted more than 200,000 indigenous trees.

FOUR SEASONS RESORT MALDIVES AT LANDAA GIRAAVARU Maldives

Four Seasons' Reefscapers project helps regenerate coral damaged by climate change. In addition, the coral-growing frames are locally produced, providing small-business development.

MASHPI LODGE Ecuador

Located in a former logging area, Mashpi works to rehabilitate biodiversity-rich cloud forest; its efforts have led to the recent discovery of **two new species**: the Mashpi torenteer frog and Mashpi magnolia.

SINGITA GRUMETI - SABORA TENTED CAMP Tanzania
Singita Grumeti's community efforts include
funding a farmers' cooperative, training
game scouts to reduce poaching (the lodge
is adjacent to Serengeti National Park), and
establishing a culinary school for locals.

SIX SENSES DOURO VALLEY Portugal

Six Senses' on-site Earth Lab teaches guests about conservation, and its **cork exchange program** collects used wine corks and trades them for tree saplings used in reforestation.

TOUR OPERATORS

EXO TRAVEL

As part of its efforts to **eliminate single-use plastics**, EXO gives its guests reusable bottles and refills them with safe, clean water from in-vehicle water bags.

LINDBLAD EXPEDITIONS

Lindblad's environmentally friendly practices include serving **sustainable seafood**. It also supports conservation and research in fragile destinations such as the Galápagos Islands.

ROYAL CARIBBEAN INTERNATIONAL

This cruise line partners with the World Wildlife Fund to educate guests on marine conservation, and its **environmental officers** focus on water conservation and recycling.

SWISS TRAVEL

Based in Costa Rica, this company sets annual targets for **reducing energy and water use** and tracks progress toward sustainability goals through a "Smart Flow" system.

WII DCHINA

This China-based tour provider's program to actively **support artisanal cultural heritage** includes establishing a pop-up bazaar in Beijing that showcases traditional crafts from all over the country.

D.C. Do-Over

A flurry of new attractions brings fresh energy to the U.S. capital.

CORE YET ANOTHER VICtory for Washington, D.C. The Washington Capitals' recent Stanley Cup win - the hockey team's first title in its 44-year history - is even more cause for celebration in this dynamic city, which has seen a surge of new restaurants, entertainment venues, exhibition spaces, and revitalized neighborhoods pop up in recent years.

"There's a whole new buzz in D.C. these days," says Jessica Griscavage. The Virtuoso travel advisor, who hails from nearby McLean, Virginia, says a wealth of notable museums, iconic sights, and buzzing nightlife firmly places the U.S. capital among the world's most vibrant and entertaining cities – one that deserves


a second look. "If you haven't been to D.C. in a while," she urges, "now is the time to come back and visit." With the lofty Ritz-Carlton Georgetown, Washington, D.C. as your swank base, here's a three-day blueprint to see what all the buzz is about.

DAY ONE

A half century before there was even a city to explore, Georgetown thrived as a port along the banks of the Potomac; today, it's a hub for high-end fashion, hip cocktail lounges, and luxe hotels. The neighborhood's historic incinerator sat abandoned for decades until its rebirth as The Ritz-Carlton Georgetown, Washington, D.C., which smartly incorporates exposed metal and brick into

its modern design. (The original gantry crane sits atop the hotel lobby space, while the 130-foot-high smokestack now houses a private venue for power lunches.) Griscavage's room to book: the 2,400-square-foot **Ritz-Carlton Suite**, with a wraparound terrace offering views of Georgetown and the river.

Ease into the weekend with a Lavender Frosé and a breath of fresh air in The Yard, the hotel's multitiered garden patio, before a little retail therapy along Georgetown's boutique-lined cobblestoned streets. At **Hu's Wear** (2906 M Street NW) and sister shop **Hu's Shoes** (3005 M Street NW), owner Marlene Hu Aldaba handpicks a curated selection of haute couture she's spotted on runaways from

Manhattan to Milan. Then make your way to Fiola Mare (3050 K Street NW), James Beard Award-winning chef Fabio Trabocchi's rustic Italian restaurant and Michelin-starred celebrity magnet (tables fill fast, so have your travel advisor book well in advance).

DAY TWO

Signature biscuits and gravy in **Degrees** Bistro provides sufficient fuel to drive a Tesla Model S, arranged exclusively through the hotel. After a brief demo of the dashboard command center and a test run around the block, you're ready to head along the Rock Creek and Potomac Parkway to the National Museum of African American History and Culture (1400 Constitution Avenue NW). NMAAHC has been the hottest exhibition ticket in town since its 2016 opening, and while admission is free (as it is at all 19 Smithsonian museums), entry passes are strictly timed and must be reserved up to three months in advance. Spend a few hours perusing the vast collection of artifacts, from a restored 1853 slave cabin and open-cockpit biplane used by the Tuskegee Airmen to Louis Armstrong's trumpet and Michael Jackson's black fedora. A current exhibit on the cultural impact of Oprah Winfrey runs through June 30, 2019.

Next up: a half-hour drive along Maryland Route 190 to nearby Potomac, Maryland, for a visit to the **Glenstone** Museum (12002 Glen Road), a private gem of contemporary art and architecture set on 200 wooded, rolling acres. A new 50,000-square-foot expansion, due for completion in late 2018, increases the exhibition space by nearly fourfold, while





Shining light (from top): A sculpted fire pit blazes on District Wharf's Recreation Pier and the NMAAHC's Segregation Gallery.


also adding a bookstore and two cafés. Guided tours of the art-filled landscape, including two recently installed outdoor sculptures, are offered daily. Admission is free, although visits must be scheduled in advance.

Back in D.C., **District Wharf** is the place to be. Griscavage calls the new mile-long waterfront development "one of the city's biggest openings in a long time. All the chefs want to be there!" That elite list includes Top Chef contestant Kwame Onwuachi, who serves up D.C.'s only Afro-Caribbean cuisine at Kith/Kin (801 Wharf Street SW). Walk off those stewed

oxtails along the Wharf's four themed piers; look to catch a live performance at the 6,000-seat, "acoustically advanced" Anthem (901 Wharf Street SW) or a more intimate venue such as the Pearl Street Warehouse (33 Pearl Street SW).

DAY THREE

Kayaking and stand-up paddleboarding on the Potomac are all the craze these days; rentals are available at Key **Bridge Boathouse** (3500 Water Street NW). Another active option: Reserve one of the hotel's complimentary bikes and cycle along a section of the C&O



(Chesapeake and Ohio) Canal's former towpath. (The 185-mile trail, which ends in Cumberland, Maryland, is spectacular during fall colors.) For a more controlled sweat, pedal one of the fitness center's Pelotons before a deep-muscle massage or other ESPA treatment in the recently transformed spa.

Spend your last capital hours checking out the Navy Yard neighborhood along the Anacostia River. Anchored by its namesake former shipyard and the National Museum of the U.S. Navy (736 Sicard Street SE), the redeveloped area is now home to trendy restaurants and bars such as craft brewery Bluejacket (300 Tingey Street SE), the Riverwalk Trail System, and plentiful green spaces, along with Nationals Park (1500 S. Capitol Street SE). With the Washington Nationals looking to make the Major League Baseball playoffs again in 2018, D.C. just may have another reason to celebrate.

Staying Power

On Bali, forward-thinking hotels help preserve the island's singular culture. Story and photography by Joel Centano

UNRISE AND A SUPER-LOW tide on Bali's Sawangan Beach tell a simultaneous story of past, present, and future. In an ageold scene, locals wade through tide pools, meditatively searching for octopuses to sell at nearby markets. Meanwhile, a 180-degree pivot reveals a coastline of contemporary hotels and the telltale signs of the island's unabating building boom.

Blessed with endless beaches, fluorescent-green rice fields, ancient Hindu temples, and welcoming residents renowned for their happiness and warmth, Indonesia's "Island of the Gods" perennially tops many travelers' wish lists - and

for good reason, says Brian Harris, a Colorado-based Virtuoso travel advisor. But as tourism rates rise - Bali now has one of Indonesia's highest concentrations of hotels and has seen its visitor numbers grow by nearly 24 percent annually, according to a recent Colliers report - there's increasing concern that this paradise be preserved.

"It's imperative to recognize that Balinese culture is the main driver of the island's tourism, and the hotels that have this ethos are the ones that succeed," says Harris. "The classic Bali dream trip can still be had," he explains, "but it requires careful planning and knowing

which properties offer pathways into local heritage."

It's this wisdom that informs my own seven-day visit, starting with a stay at The Ritz-Carlton, Bali in Nusa Dua, an Indian Ocean-facing resort where guests can truly engage in local customs. Along its stretch of Sawangan Beach, for instance, a resident Hindu priest leads earlymorning soul-purification rituals meant to cleanse body, mind, and spirit while evoking blessings from the Hindu gods of the sun and sea. Guests can also craft Balinese kites and participate in ecoefforts such as sea turtle releases and shore cleanups.

Beyond the beach, bartenders host cocktail clinics based on arak (Bali's local spirit); a sarong concierge teaches proper etiquette for how to wear this traditional fabric and heads tours to sarong-making studios; and chefs lead strolls through nearby Kedonganan market that culminate in a cooking class and lunch back at the resort's Bejana restaurant.

"My culinary style reflects my home cooking, learned since I was a child," chef Made Karyasa tells me while we meander through stalls bursting with vibrant rambutan and dragon fruit, giant prawns, shredded coconut, bamboo shoots, and an array of Balinese spices we later use to prepare staples such as bumbu genep (a versatile paste used in various Balinese dishes) and tum bebek (spiced minced duck wrapped in banana leaves). "Teaching others is a way for me to pass on this tradition."

The resort's cultural concierge offers additional insight into Bali's identity through Baris dance classes, Indonesian language lessons, and trips to area sites. Following my market tour and lunch, I travel with him to the eleventh-century Uluwatu temple, timed to see a community Kecak performance, in which scores of locals enact an ancient ritual ceremony, dancing and chanting in unison as the setting sun drops into the sea.

"BALI HAS AN ABUNDANCE OF SEN-

sory riches," says Varya Simpson, a California-based Virtuoso advisor and former Asian studies instructor at UC Berkeley. "In even the smallest corners of every village," she adds, "you'll find a visual feast of striking scenery, along with the open faces of the friendly people who define this island."

I'm reminded of her words later in the week while touring Ubud – Bali's cultural and spiritual center – via a vintage Volkswagen convertible. From my base at Mandapa, a Ritz-Carlton Reserve, I join a local guide and driver who take me along

narrow, winding roads that feel more like tunnels carved into surrounding forests profuse with elephant grass, bamboo, and banana trees. As we pilgrimage to a string of the region's cultural gems, white herons take flight from terraced rice fields, women stroll through village streets balancing tiered baskets filled with fruit and flowers on their heads, and incense wafts from ornate roadside shrines.

By midafternoon, we've visited the eleventh-century Pura Kehen, Bangli village's oldest and most sacred Hindu temple; the largely undiscovered Tukad Cepung waterfall (a trek down steep paths and through knee-deep pools is well worth the effort, as you're likely to have the place to yourself); and pedestrian-friendly Penglipuran village to see its traditional homes, gardens, and shops. The journey also provides chances to meet with local artisans, such as I Made Ada, a master woodcarver from Garuda village whose friendly welcome is as trip-worthy as his work.

Expect the same focus on Balinese culture back at the resort. Guests connect with its artists-in-residence, for example, during exhibitions and workshops, prepare flower tower offerings using locally grown blossoms and coconut leaves, and, within Mandapa's own rice fields, learn to sow the crop while discussing its significance

ROADSIDE ATTRACTION "Everywhere you turn in Bali, there's something beautiful," says Polly Purser, director of heritage at the John Hardy jewelry workshop. Though she's describing the island's aesthetic, her words could just as well be about this studio-cum-cultural experience on the road from Nusa Dua to Ubud. Visitors can take a guided tour of the campus, set amid rice fields and built with low-impact materials, to see its artisans bring handcrafted jewelry to life (all pieces are made from recycled gold and silver, and the company is Responsible Jewellery Council-certified). Allow time for lunch with its staff, almost all of whom come from local communities. A new half-day master class lets guests design their own jewelry; the artists will later finish your work and ship it home to you.

in everyday life. "Rice is at the root of our culture," my teacher, Winana, tells me, all the while smiling as he details its elaborate planting ceremonies and ubiquity in Balinese meals. "If we have food, we must have rice." Though a portion of the region's fields has recently been lost to development, he notes, some 80 percent of local families still grow rice on their land.

Spiritual and holistic therapies, based on ancient Balinese beliefs, also highlight stays here, with programs that include water-blessing rituals with a priestess and energy treatments with an intuitive blind healer. Vedic astrology, chakra balancing, and meditation sessions round out the spa menu, as do active disciplines such as vinyasa, hatha, and kundalini yoga.

On my last evening, I'm inspired to try a yoga class at the spa's riverside pavilion, taught - to my surprise - by Winana, who turns out to also be a yoga master. It's my first such class, but after a week on Bali, it's not too difficult to get into the flow, especially when guided by Winana's meditations. We're most likely to be at peace with the future and the past when we do well to focus on the present moment, he reminds his class. "Because happiness," he emphasizes with his unceasing smile, "is right now." It's a valuable souvenir and send-off - and a pleasant reminder that, despite all the changes, so many of Bali's integral traditions still abide.

BALINESE BLESSINGS

How to have a heavenly time in Nusa Dua, Ubud, and beyond.

"One of the best times to visit Bali is during the dry season in June," says Brian Harris. "It's less busy than July and August, and has good surfing conditions. Shoulder season in September also offers lower rates and fewer crowds."

STAY

Additional cultural experiences at the flower-filled, 313-room Ritz-Carlton, Bali include sunset meditation sessions and lanternmaking classes for kids. Surfing lessons and swan neck showers in the spa's Hydro-Vital Pool are available for the aquatically inclined, as are "floating breakfasts" in (yes, in) your suite or villa pool. Doubles from \$250; Virtuoso travelers receive breakfast daily, a \$100 resort credit, and private airport transfers.

Mandapa, a Ritz-Carlton Reserve built in the spirit of a traditional



The coast is clear — and steeped in culture, history, and nature — at America's seaside stars.

e didn't set out from Miami to shock. The first time I took my son, then age 10, to the

Florida Keys, I did my best to model good-parenting beach practices in the way of sunscreen, buddy-swimming, and sun hats. I also packed to uphold decorum with stylish cover-ups and our best resort wear. But my dress standards quickly lapsed to swimsuits alone when the string of beaches that edge the Keys beckoned us repeatedly to park our rental car and jump in. By the time we reached Key West two days later, via the 113-mile coastal Overseas Highway, we were wearing damp, sandy towels as sarongs and, embodied in the widest grins of our trip, the evident satisfaction of not caring one bit about appearances.

Combining the thrill of lands' end and the wonder of the limitless beyond, coastal getaways have a way of delivering serenity stat. "Seaside towns are places to forget worries, relax, literally dig your feet in the sand, get grounded, and reset," says Amber Bogard, a Virtuoso travel advisor based in Miami. "Studies show that being around water and nature is cathartic and nurturing," and such benefits, she adds, can be had whether you're at a historic New England village or a tropical Hawaiian surf break.

The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration puts the official tally for the U.S. shoreline at just over 95,000 miles, including Hawaii and Alaska. Covering a fraction of them, the following five sea stars span the coastal range of appeal from natural to cultural, laid-back to lively.

Key West, Florida

The Conch Republic rises again.

he U.S. held its breath when Hurricane Irma made landfall in South Florida last fall, but fortunately, Key West, a onetime pirate lair 90 miles north of Cuba, bounced back in the same defiant spirit that once drove its campaign to secede from the country as the Conch Republic in the early 1980s.

"The Keys rebounded in a way that demonstrates the region's sense of community and pride," says Bogard. "Key West is a fun, high-energy tropical island that offers a piece of the Caribbean in the U.S. with a quirky, small-town vibe."


New attractions on the island include

the fall opening of Florida Keys **National Wildlife Refuges Nature** Center on nearby Big Pine Key (30587 Overseas Highway), home to elfin Key deer. New butterfly and "perfume" gardens, the latter devoted to fragrant flowers, recently opened at the Key West Garden Club at West Martello Tower (1100 Atlantic Boulevard), a National Historic site. The 28-acre **Truman Waterfront Park** (21 East Quay Road), adjacent to one of Key West's best beaches, has added bike lanes, a children's splash park, and a 500-seat amphitheater.

Cheer Key West's resilience on the

new Cocktail Crawl walking tour, fueled by signature local drinks such as the Hemingway daiquiri, or take a mojito-making class at the Key West First Legal Rum Distillery (105 Simonton Street).

BE THERE: On a satellite isle a sevenminute ferry ride from Key West, Sunset Key Cottages models escapism with new beach yoga sessions, sunset supper picnics, and ice cream delivery to its 40 cottages via a classic conch cruiser bike. Doubles from \$795; Virtuoso travelers receive breakfast daily and a \$100 resort credit.



With its Cuban flair and colorful street art, Miami is an urban analogue to Key West. Azamara Club Cruises' five-day Key West and Havana sailing aboard the 690-passenger Azamara Journey starts and ends in Miami, providing time to visit Little Havana, the Wynwood Walls to spy its vibrant murals, and the South Beach strands. Departure: November 20, 2018; from \$1,074.







Newport, Rhode **Island**

Wicked good seafood meets historic mansions in the Ocean State.

hen Gilded Age magnates sought a summer escape, the Vanderbilts, Astors, and their cohorts chose Newport, a craggy spot with fresh breezes, a safe harbor, and dramatic views at the base of Aquidneck Island, building grand mansions that attest to the lavish tastes of the time.

"Early nineteenth-century Americans didn't have a style of their own, so they looked to Europe to emulate their grand houses," says Fran Kramer, a Rochester, New York-based Virtuoso advisor and antiques collector who frequently shops in Newport. She recommends strolling the Cliff Walk, which divides the Atlantic from the town's titanic homes in a timeerasing three-mile route. "Newport is like the Hamptons of Rhode Island," Kramer

adds, "except that it's very accessible; you can walk to everything and get close to its homes."

This summer, the grandest of Newport's grand mansions, The Breakers (44 Ochre Point Avenue) has opened a new welcome center with a sunlit café where guests can relax after estate tours, including one that explores the house's below-stairs workings via an underground tunnel. A new pass to Doris Duke's home, Rough Point (680 Bellevue Avenue), offers entree to the house, grounds, and special exhibitions, which include the bespoke jewelry produced for the tobacco heiress.

"Seafood is, in itself, worth the trip to Rhode Island - think New England lobster, stuffed quahogs [clams], and creamy 'chowda,' " says Kramer. Order fresh-from-the-boat dishes at the new Stoneacre Brasserie (28 Washington Square), then toast the former "rum capital of the world" on the new **Newport Cocktail Tour.**

BE THERE: Housed in a nineteenthcentury "summer cottage" on Newport's Cliff Walk, The Chanler at Cliff Walk channels global destinations, from Morocco to Martha's Vineyard, in 20 themed rooms. Doubles from \$660; Virtuoso travelers receive breakfast daily and a \$100 dining credit.

For further New England charm, check out Bar Harbor, also originally a summer colony, or more-bustling Portland, Maine, filled with lobster boats and oyster bars. Regent Seven Seas Cruises' 11-day New York City-to-Montréal voyage aboard the 490-passenger Seven Seas Navigator visits both and includes a shore excursion to Acadia National Park. Departure: October 18, 2018; from \$7,299.


Santa Barbara, California

A taste of the Mediterranean amid SoCal scenery.

ou don't have to squint to see sunny Spain in Santa Barbara. The city's terra-cotta roof tiles and whitewashed colonial architecture speak to its past, first as an eighteenth-century military outpost and mission, and later as a climate-blessed stage for silent American films.

"Santa Barbara is known as the 'American Riviera,' but it offers more than Europe's," says Limor Decter, a New York City-based Virtuoso advisor. "It has a great Spanish and Mediterranean feel, but also the spacious grandeur of California, with the Pacific on one side and the Santa Ynez Mountains on the other."

A gateway to the wine district of the Santa Ynez Valley, Santa Barbara has developed a strong reputation for food and wine, bolstered by the recent opening of Smithy Kitchen + Bar (7 E. Anapamu Street) from chef Lauren Herman, who touts locally grown, raised, and caught ingredients. Chef Jessi Singh's Indian food at the new Bibi Ji (734 State Street) comes paired



with regional vintages selected by James Beard-awarded sommelier Rajat Parr. Bluewater Grill (15 E. Cabrillo Boulevard) serves the area's famous sea urchins, as well as oysters and locally caught fish.

Santa Barbara wouldn't be the American Riviera without swimming, sunning, and surfing on East or Butterfly beaches. Its old-world traditions include Sunday matches at the Santa Barbara Polo & Racquet Club (3375 Foothill

Road), May through October, to stomp the divots between chuckers.

BE THERE: Venturing round-trip from L.A., Princess Cruises' four-day West Coast sailing calls on Santa Barbara en route to Ensenada, Mexico. Shore excursions from the 3,080-passenger Emerald Princess explore the Old Mission Santa Barbara, café- and boutique-lined State Street, and Santa Ynez Valley wineries. There's scenic drama all along the California coastline, from San Francisco down to Santa Barbara. Astoria, Oregon

History, rugged scenery, and renewed vitality where river meets ocean.

rom Fort Clatsop, where Lewis and Clark spent the winter of 1805-06, to restored canneries and fur-trade wharfs, Astoria tells the story of westward expansion against a powerful backdrop where the Columbia River joins the Pacific.

"Astoria is where history meets nature," says Cate Caruso, a Virtuoso advisor located near Portland, Oregon. "And it started with a purpose: Fur traders loaded and unloaded their cargo here. It was also the first settlement on the Pacific Coast and had the first U.S. post office west of the Rockies." For travelers looking for a culturally authentic destination, she adds, "This

town had a reason for being rather than becoming a beach destination simply because it's pretty."

Today, galleries, shops, and smallbatch breweries have revived Astoria's historic waterfront. Learn how pilots navigate massive freighters over the Columbia River bar at the Columbia River Maritime Museum (1792 Marine Drive). Then visit the Museum of Whimsy (1215 Duane Street), in a former 1924 bank now filled with vintage costumes and antique furniture.

Among the dozen-plus breweries in the area, slug a pint of 3-Way IPA at **Fort** George Brewery + Public House (1483 Duane Street) or be sure to nab a spot

on the riverfront deck at the Astoria **Brewing Company** (144 11th Street) and watch the freighters pass by.

BE THERE: UnCruise Adventures

eight-day culinary-themed voyage aboard the 86-passenger Legacy spends a day in Astoria before heading up the Columbia River. Astoria excursions visit boutique seafood companies and craft breweries with calorie-burning options to stroll the Astoria Riverwalk and climb the 164step Astoria Column for ocean and river panoramas. Departures: Multiple dates, November 2 to December 7, 2019; from \$4,195.



Worth a wander: the string of shoreside towns south of Astoria, including quaint Depoe Bay and seashell-strewn Cannon Beach. Hanalei (Kauai), Hawaii

The spirit of aloha in retro-relaxation mode.

f you're looking for old Hawaii the laid-back, underdeveloped, lush beach idyll where slack-key guitar hangs in the air and surfers tell time by the tides - look to Kauai, the oldest and northernmost island in the chain. And, more specifically, Hanalei, reached via a one-lane bridge on the North Shore.

"Visiting Hanalei is like taking a walk back in time," says Randy King, a Virtuoso advisor based in Honolulu. "Hanalei, which means 'lei-making' in English, has kept its small-town feeling

with that intimate charm that's slowly disappearing on other Hawaiian islands."

King's perfect day starts with a run on one of the town's long white-sand beaches, then continues with shopping in boutiques such as **Havaiki** (5-5161 Kuhio Highway) for island-made wood carvings, followed by a fortifying plate lunch - like an island version of the Southern meat-and-three - from one of the food trucks that pull up shoreside to feed the surfers.


Add to that a stroll in the Limahuli Garden & Preserve (5-8291 Kuhio

Highway) - visit ntbg.org for its reopening date following recent floods; a class at Hanalei Surf School (5-5080 Kuhio Highway); and a tour of the pristine Na Pali Coast by helicopter or catamaran.

BE THERE: Just ten minutes down the road from Hanalei, the 251-room St. Regis Princeville is "a slice of luxury in paradise," says King. New on property: daily morning paddles in a **traditional outrigger canoe**. Doubles from \$595; Virtuoso travelers receive breakfast daily and a \$100 resort credit.

It's hard to choose between cultural Oahu, adventurous Maui, rugged Hawaii Island, and the garden isle of Kauai. Good news: Tauck covers each of the four islands over a leisurely 12-day tour that includes everything from a visit to Pearl Harbor to a catamaran sailing along the Kohala Coast. 






LENS THE WORLD

A look at sought-after destinations and ports of call through the eyes of legendary photographer Steve McCurry.

teve McCurry's 30-plus-year career has taken him to some of the most remote - and tumultuous - corners of the world. His iconic portrait of a green-eyed Afghan refugee girl is perhaps one of contemporary photography's most recognizable photos. For his current collaboration with Silversea Cruises, McCurry is turning his lens on some of the line's most compelling destinations, revealing the soul of places through their landscapes, people, and wildlife. Here, a few neverbefore-published images from his recent journeys.







LIVE THE PICTURES

Sail away with Silversea to McCurry-documented destinations.

- ◆ Silversea timed its 13-day circumnavigations of Japan to give cruisers the best shot at seeing the cherry blossoms' peak. The round-trip route from Tokyo on the 596passenger Silver Muse calls at Maizuru (for Kyoto excursions), Karatsu (known for its castle and pottery), Busan, a South Korean beach-resort city, and more. One high point: a cable car ride in the volcanic Hakkoda Mountains outside Aomori. Departures: April 16 and 29, 2019; from \$7,200.
- ◆ Explore **Arctic Norway** aboard the line's newest expedition ship, the 254-passenger Silver Cloud. The ten-day cruise from Longyearbyen to Tromsø charts a course through fjords and pack ice in search of polar bears, walrus, and some of the Northern Hemisphere's largest bird colonies. A fleet of Zodiacs and sea kayaks allows for up-close wildlife encounters, glacier hikes, and visits to fishing villages en route. Departure: July 12, 2019; from \$9,180.
- ◆ The 100-passenger Silver Galapagos is a fixture in Darwin's playground, serving up the Galápagos' greatest hits on seven-day sailings from San Cristóbal to Baltra (or the reverse). The islands' wildlife features prominently, including Galápagos sea lions in Gardner Bay, marine iguanas everywhere, and giant tortoises on San Cristóbal. But the landscape also shines, with lava flows and red-sand beaches. Departures: Multiple dates, year-round; from \$7,100.




